Exchange Duration	One semester
Language Proficiency Requirement	The language of instruction is Swedish and English. It is recommended that the student's level of English language proficiency is equivalent to at least IELTS 6.5/ TOEFL 90.  The Swedish language requirement for exchange students wishing to study Swedish-taught courses is level C1, or B2 depending on course, of the Common European Framework of Reference for languages (CEFR).
Course Information	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 30 ECTS. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the <a href="SEP Credit Transfer Calculator">SEP Credit Transfer Calculator</a> for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.

Accommodation	<ol> <li>Courses at the School of Industrial Design are not available for students applying through a university wide agreement.</li> <li>The Faculty of Fine and Performing Arts, (including the Malmö Academies of Music, Art and Theatre) and the Faculty of Medicine mainly admits students within specific faculty/department agreements.</li> <li>Course enrolment is not guaranteed. Exchange students need to be flexible with their course preference.</li> <li>Housing is limited and not guaranteed for exchange students.</li> <li>For more information on housing and related information, please visit: www.lunduniversity.lu.se/housing.</li> </ol>
Visa	In general, all students from countries outside the EU/EEA need to have a residence permit to study in Sweden if they are planning on staying for more than three months. The permit must be issued before arrival in Sweden.  All students are advised to apply for the residence permit immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email from their host university. However, please do not submit it earlier than <b>four months</b> before the first day of your residence permit period.  Please refer to this website for more details.  The permit process could take up to 3 months to process. Please refer here for the estimated time required for processing.
Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to <a href="https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/">https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/</a> .  At Lund University, incoming exchange students are covered by Kammarkollegiets group insurance <i>Student IN</i> . This includes accident coverage, costs for home transport in case of illness or accident, liability coverage, legal expenses and property coverage. It is however very important that you read the terms and conditions carefully so that you know exactly for what you are insured. <i>Student IN</i> is only valid in Sweden. Please refer <a href="here">here</a> for more information.  It is recommended that you purchase a comprehensive travel insurance for the full duration of your stay abroad, including your personal travel within/outside Sweden. Please review your insurance coverages to ensure that they meet your needs.
