Course Information	Students are expected to take 60 University of St Andrews credits which is usually equivalent to 2-3 courses. Underload of 40 credits are possible with approval from the Associate Dean. Overloads of up to 75 credits are possible with similar approval. The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is St Andrews 60 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. Course restrictions: Students are not allowed to take courses from the Faculty of Medicine. Course list: Academics Study Abroad and Exchange students have the opportunity to enroll in any courses offered by Faculty of Arts, Sciences, and Divinity. At the University of St Andrews, a typical credit load is 60 University of St Andrews credits per semester (equivalent to 30 ECTS) or 120 credits (60 ECTS) per academic year. This translates to around 2-3 modules per semester. Students are encouraged to develop deep disciplinary knowledge in at least one area as well as the competencies associated with forming connections between disciplines, allowing them to become adaptive innovators. Teaching at St Andrews is both innovative and research-driven. Instruction
