Information for Students applying for Exchange

A. University	<p>The University of Warwick</p> <p>https://warwick.ac.uk/study/studyabroad/</p>

C. Academics	
i) Module Mapping & Credits Transfer	<p>Please ensure that your Study Plan is approved by the academics at your home Faculty before the exchange.</p> <p>Modules approved in the past might not be offered by the host university or approved by your Faculty when it is time for your exchange. Please check the latest course offerings at the host universities while you are preparing your Study Plan.</p>
ii) Academic Calendar	<p>Semester 2 (Spring & Summer): Early January to late June (including examination)</p> <p>https://warwick.ac.uk/study/termdates</p>
iii) Exchange Duration	<p>Full-year or semester 2 (Spring & Summer) exchange is strongly recommended due to overlapping academic calendar and the design of curriculum for certain modules.</p> <p>In order to earn sufficient credits to map back to NUS, NUS students should complete the Semester 2 (Spring and Summer term at Warwick) before returning to NUS.</p>
iv) Examination	<p>‘VA’ (visiting assessment) is not available for all subjects. Formal examinations are held in the summer.</p> <p>Failure to select an approved method of examination or assessment will result in a zero mark on the transcript provided at the end of your placement at Warwick.</p>
v) Curriculum Structure	<p>Most of the modules at Warwick are designed for year-long exchanges.</p> <p>Full-year or semester 2 (Spring & Summer) exchange is strongly recommended if you wish to map credits back to NUS.</p>
vi) Entry Requirements	<p>You should:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> 1. Have completed a minimum of one year’s undergraduate study at NUS;

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	<ol style="list-style-type: none"> 2. Have a minimum 'B' average grade or 60% to 65% average marks; and no single grade below 'C' in the current/intended discipline/major 3. Not be in the graduating semester of studies while on exchange; 4. Propose an appropriate programme of study at the host university; 5. Be proficient in English and able to communicate effectively in both academic and social settings; 6. Show the aptitude, motivation and maturity, to thrive in the environment at the host university; and 7. Have sufficient funds for all fees, personal and living expenses for the duration of the study abroad at the host university.
<p>vii) Language Proficiency Requirements</p>	<p>For students coming to the UK for less than 6 months, no proof of English language is required.</p> <p>For students coming to the UK for more than 6 months, the UKVI guidance for the Student Route visas require specific language tests to be provided which will depend on the students' nationality, not their country of study. The list of acceptable qualifications and Secure English Language Tests (SELTs) as proof of English language are available here: English Language Entry Requirements</p> <p>To see the English language requirements for each department, please see English Language Requirements.</p>
<p>viii) Faculties & Schools accepting exchange students</p>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Faculty of Arts • Faculty of Science • Faculty of Social Sciences (excluding School of Law and Warwick Business School)
<p>ix) Modules Compatibility</p>	<p>Only Undergraduate modules are available to NUS exchange students.</p> <p>As Exchange students do not finalise their module choices until after they arrive at Warwick, Warwick cannot guarantee any specific modules to you before then. However, Warwick's Study Abroad team will give other guidance on module choices where possible.</p> <p>In order to avoid clashing timetables, you should take same level modules offer by the same department while on exchange at Warwick.</p> <p>Please see the module and credits information here.</p>
<p>x) Module restrictions and pre-requisites</p>	<p>Postgraduate modules are not open to undergraduate exchange students.</p>

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	<p>Modules from the following faculties/departments are NOT available to NUS students with no matching major (this list is not exhaustive):</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • Warwick Business School • Warwick School of Law <p>Your base academic department at Warwick can affect which modules you can take e.g. in many cases you will be expected to select most of your modules from your base department.</p>
<p>D. Application</p>	
<p>i) Procedures</p>	<p>NUS Registrar’s Office will consolidate the nominations from NUS Faculties and Schools before submitting to Warwick. Nominated students must apply for exchange via Warwick’s online application system before the stipulated deadlines.</p> <p>For application process, refer to: https://warwick.ac.uk/services/studentopportunity/studentmobility/studya_twarwick/applicationprocess/. Warwick will send the application instruction to nominated students.</p>
<p>ii) Deadlines</p>	<p>All NUS student must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home Faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university.</p> <p>Failure to submit a formal application to the host university will result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been selected by NUS for the exchange.</p>

<p>i) University Accommodation</p>	<p>Warwick accommodation is subject to availability of rooms and meeting the deadlines and conditions as outlined on the apply webpage. https://warwick.ac.uk/services/accommodation</p>
<p>ii) Private Accommodation</p>	<p>Warwick Accommodation have a portfolio of private accommodation (off campus) accommodation. It is more usual for exchange students to live on campus. Standard Visitor Visa for Semester Exchange

If you are a Singapore citizen or a citizen of another country on the UK non-visa nationals list, and if your course of studies is less than 6 months, you will request entry to the UK as a Standard Visitor when you arrive.

Singapore citizens do not normally need to meet with a Border Force agent, and will be able to enter the UK through E-gates. The E-gates will automatically grant you permission to stay in the UK for up to 6 months.

You will not receive a stamp on your passport thus it is important that you retain evidence of when you entered the UK. Hence, please keep your boarding pass or evidence of your flight itinerary.

Student Visa for Full-Year Exchange

You need a Student Visa for a full-year exchange in Warwick.

All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they received the official offer letter/email from their host university. Some visa application processes can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.

<p>i) Health/Medical Insurance</p>	<p>Students who are on exchange in UK for less than six months are not entitled to subsidised NHS treatment. Therefore, semester-based exchange students are encouraged to purchase additional insurance to cover medical costs, hospitalisation expenses and emergency evacuation costs which might be incurred while they are on exchange.</p> <p>All registered NUS students are covered under the group personal accident and medical insurance as well as the student travel insurance.
