Exchange Duration	One semester
Course Information	The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 16 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the <u>SEP Credit Transfer Calculator</u> for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.
Accommodation	All inbound exchange applicants will apply for undergraduate housing, but it is not guaranteed and students are expected to be flexible in what they receive. Visit the <u>BU Housing website</u> for more information about on-campus housing options.
Visa	BU's International Students and Scholars Office (ISSO) will issue your Form DS2019, which you will need to apply for your J-1 visa. ISSO processing can take up to 6 weeks. When your Form DS-2019 is ready, it will be e-mailed directly to you with instructions for applying. Required documents are listed in the Exchange Student Application section at: www.bu.edu/abroad/inbound/admissions
	Note: All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email and instructions from their host university. Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.
Insurance	All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance.
