Course Information	 Minimum workload per semester: 36 units (approximately 4 courses) Maximum workload per semester: 54 units (approximately 6 courses) The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 45 units. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer. 			
Accommodation	On-campus housing is normally only available for undergraduate students and must be applied for by the deadline or as early as possible. All assignments are based upon availability. There is no guarantee for exact preference matches. On and off campus housing options can be found on the website: https://www.cmu.edu/housing/			
Visa	Once application is received and confirm acceptance, CMU will send the student's DS-2019 Certificate of Eligibility, allowing them to then make an appointment at a US Embassy/Consulate to request for the J-1 student exchange visa.

Some visa applications can take up to 2 months to process. Your exchange at the host university depends on the clearance by the immigration of the host country.
