i) Procedures	All NUS students have to be nominated by NUS before they can apply for a fee-waiver exchange at the host university.

ii) Deadlines	All NUS students must abide by the internal application deadline set by their home Faculty for exchange participation in the following academic year. After clearing the internal application and selection process, students have to take note of the application deadline set by the host university. Failure to submit a formal application to the host university by the stipulated deadline, may result in your exchange being forfeited even if you have been				
	selected by NUS for the exchange.

F. Visa					
Consular/Visa Regulation	Upon receiving your DS-2019, you will need to apply for your J-1 visa at a U.S. consulate or embassy. We recommend you visit the website of the US Embassy/Consulate where you wish to apply for your visa, and follow the				





procedures for documentation, interview request, etc. In general, you will need to present:

- 1. A valid passport from your own government.
- A "Certificate of Eligibility" for a temporary stay in the U.S. (Form DS-2019 by Rice University or another sponsor).
- Financial documents to prove you have the funds required for a least a year's stay in the U.S. (as indicated on the DS-2019).
- 4. Proof of payment of the SEVIS fee. All J-1 visa applicants need to pay the one time SEVIS fee prior to

applying for a visa. Keep your receipt as proof of payment to present to the US Consulate, port of entry

officials when entering the U.S., OISS upon check-in, and for your records. For more information visit:

G. Safety, Health & Medical Insurance

i) Health/Medical Insurance

All registered NUS students are covered under the university health insurance and the blanket travel insurance. For more information on the blanket travel insurance, please refer to the following link: https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/

Students are strongly encouraged to purchase a supplemental travel insurance to ensure they are adequately covered during their exchange semester.

In addition, students will be required to enrol in the compulsory health insurance policy or scheme at their SEP host university.

Medical costs in the United States are very high. All students at Rice University are required to have health insurance coverage, and show proof of coverage before registering for classes. All non-immigrant visa holders and their dependents are required to carry insurance for the duration of their program. Health insurance is necessary for everyone in the United States.

A properly completed Health Data form is required for registering for classes. Deadline: June 1st for Fall entry; December 1st for Spring entry

Additionally, all new students must provide documentation of meningococcal vaccination. This Texas law applies to all students under the age of 30 regardless of classification (e.g., part-time, full time). Vaccination
