Course Information	Minimum: 12 credits (4 courses) Maximum:17 credits The regular semester workload for full-time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Please note that the actual number of credits earned is subject to the units exchange ratio at the point of credit transfer.

Insurance

All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance. For more information on the university medical insurance, please refer to https://myportal.nus.edu.sg/studentportal/student-insurance/all/.

In addition, students will be required to enrol in the compulsory health insurance policy or scheme at their SEP host university.

Students have the option to automatically be enrolled in GW Health Insurance (https://healthcenter.gwu.edu/insurance) or if they have their own they can submit a waiver to the Student Health Center
