Course Information	<p>Undergraduate Minimum workload per semester: 12 units Maximum workload per semester: 19 units</p> <p>The regular semester workload for full- time undergraduate students as determined by the Office of the Provost is 15 credits. Credits earned at the host university may not be directly equivalent to NUS credits and you can refer to the SEP Credit Transfer Calculator for information on units exchange ratio at the host university. Course availability will vary from year to year, but the official course schedule for each Spring is released in October, and in March for the following Fall. <p>Accommodation</p>	<p>Housing is not guaranteed for students. It is difficult for students only attending in Fall semesters to secure on-campus housing. <p>Visa</p>	<p>All students are advised to apply for the necessary visa immediately after they receive the official offer letter/email from their host university.</p> <p>Some visa application processes can take up to 2 months to process. <p>Insurance</p>	<p>All full-time NUS students are covered under the university's Student Group Personal Accident & Medical Insurance and the Student Travel Insurance.
