Notes for New Students:

- 1. The cohort-based fee system is introduced for the new graduate intake of all College/Faculties/Schools from AY2022/23. Under this fee system, tuition fees for an intake cohort of students will be based on the fees for that cohort throughout the student's entire candidature. While fees continue to be reviewed annually and adjustments made as and when necessary with each new cohort of students, each new cohort will know the exact amount of tuition fees they have to pay per year throughout their entire candidature. This enables students to plan better for the financing of their graduate studies.
 - a) With effect from AY2019/2020, graduate coursework students who exceeded their <u>normal</u> candidature will have to pay full, non-subsidised fees (i.e. fees for students not in receipt of MOE subsidy), during their extended semesters. (Note: All students, including graduate research students, to refer to this <u>link</u> for residency requirement, normal and maximum candidature; and this <u>link</u> on MOE subsidy.)
 - b) From AY2024/2025 onwards, Master's by Research and PhD students who are in Year 5 and Year 7 of their studies respectively and beyond, will be required to pay the full, non-subsidised tuition fees (i.e. fees for students not in receipt of MOE subsidy).
- For students who are Singapore Citizens and Singapore Permanent Residents, the tuition fees quoted here are subsidised by the Singapore government (through the Ministry of Education, MOE) and are <u>exclusive</u> of prevailing GST. The applicable GST for these students is subsidised by MOE. The prevailing GST is 9% with effect from 1st January 2024.
- 3. The prevailing GST (9%, effective from 1st January 2024) on the fees payable will be borne by International Students. The tuition fees quoted here are <u>inclusive</u> of the prevailing GST.
- 4. Students who are <u>not</u> in receipt of MOE Subsidy will have to pay the non-subsidised fee amounts as quoted here (which are inclusive of the prevailing GST). The prevailing GST is 9% with effect from 1st January 2024.
- 5. Students who have previously enjoyed government subsidy or sponsorship by a Singapore government agency (such as scholarships offered by the Ministries, Public Service Commission and Statutory Boards) in a graduate programme should refer to the <u>Eligibility Guidelines for MOE Subsidy</u>. Students who are not eligible for MOE subsidy are also not eligible for most scholarships. For more details, please refer to <u>Scholarships/Awards</u>.
- 6. SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy:

Students who are Singapore Citizens, aged 40 and above (based on the year which the student turns 40 years old) and enrolled in MOE-subsidised coursework programmes may be eligible for higher subsidy under the SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy. The fees payable will be 60% lower than the standard subsidised fees payable by other Singaporean students. The amount of fees payable will be reflected in their individual student bill. Students who are not eligible for MOE subsidy are also not eligible for the SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy.

- a) Students, who are required to pay Liquidated Damages (LD) to MOE for breaking the bond, would have to pay the total amount of MOE Subsidy under Service Obligation (reflected in their <u>individual student bill</u>) plus 10% interest rate compounded at the end of each academic year.

- 9. Special Term:

Fees are chargeable for students on coursework programmes reading courses in Special Term.

a) Full-time and part-time students admitted from AY2019/2020 are charged on a per Unit basis based on the respective full-time student rates, for courses they read during the Special Term. The fee calculation is based on a full-time student taking a maximum load of 20-24 Units in a regular semester or 40-48 Units per annum as per their programme requirement. Fees for full-time and part-time students are the same for the courses read in Special Term.

Notes for Existing Students:

- 1. The cohort-based fee system is introduced for the new graduate intake of all College/Faculties/Schools from AY2022/2023. Under this fee system, tuition fees for an intake cohort of students will be based on the fees for that cohort throughout the student's entire candidature. While fees continue to be reviewed annually and adjustments made as and when necessary with each new cohort of students, each new cohort will know the exact amount of tuition fees they have to pay per year throughout their entire candidature. This enables students to plan better for the financing of their graduate studies.
- 2. All fees quoted here are in Singapore Dollars (S\$). Tuition fees for AY2021/2022 cohorts and before are reviewed yearly and thus, subject to revision.
 - a) The tuition fee schedule for the remaining programme duration for graduate coursework (GDC) and graduate research (GDR) programmes for Singapore Citizens (SC), Singapore Permanent Residents (SPR) and International Students (IS) admitted in AY2021/2022 will be as follow:

- b) With effect from AY2019/2020, graduate coursework students who exceeded their <u>normal</u> candidature will have to pay full, non-subsidised fees (i.e. fees for students not in receipt of MOE subsidy), during their extended semesters. Students who are admitted prior to AY2019/2020 and take longer than the <u>maximum</u> candidature period will have to pay full, non-subsidised fees during their extended semesters.
 (Note: All students, including graduate research students, to refer to this <u>link</u> for residency requirement, normal and maximum candidature; and this link on MOE subsidy.)
- c) From AY2024/2025 onwards, Master's by Research and PhD students who are in Year 5 and Year 7 of their studies respectively and beyond, will be required to pay the full, non-subsidised tuition fees (i.e. fees for students not in receipt of MOE subsidy).
- 3. For students who are Singapore Citizens and Singapore Permanent Residents, the tuition fees quoted here are subsidised by the Singapore government (through the Ministry of Education, MOE) and are exclusive of prevailing GST. The applicable GST for these students is subsidised by MOE. The prevailing GST is 9% with effect from 1st January 2024.
 - a) With effect from AY2016/2017 intake, MOE no longer subsidises the GST for International Students with Service Obligation/Graduate Assistantship Programme. The prevailing GST (9%, effective from 1st January 2024) will be levied on the fees payable for International Students. The amount quoted here are inclusive of the prevailing GST.
 - b) With effect from AY2016/2017 intake, the prevailing GST (9%, effective from 1st January 2024) on the fees payable is borne by International Students. The tuition fees quoted here are <u>inclusive</u> of the prevailing GST.
- 4. Students who are <u>not</u> in receipt of MOE subsidy will have to pay the non-subsidised fee amounts as quoted here (which are inclusive of the prevailing GST). The prevailing GST is 9% with effect from 1st January 2024.
- 5. Students who have previously enjoyed government subsidy or sponsorship by a Singapore government agency (such as scholarships offered by the Ministries, Public Service Commission and Statutory Boards) in a graduate programme should refer to the <u>Eligibility Guidelines for MOE Subsidy</u>. Students who are not eligible for MOE subsidy are also not eligible for most scholarships. For more details, please refer to <u>Scholarships/Awards</u>.
- 6. SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy:

Students who are Singapore Citizens, aged 40 and above (based on the year which the student turns 40 years old) and enrolled in MOE-subsidised coursework programmes may be eligible for higher subsidy under the SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy. The fees payable will be 60% lower than the standard subsidised fees payable by other Singaporean students. The amount of fees payable will be reflected in their individual student bill. Students who are not eligible for MOE subsidy are also not eligible for the SkillsFuture Mid-Career Enhanced Subsidy.

7. Service Obligation Scheme:

The University may deem it feasible, based on industry demand, to implement a Service Obligation (in some MOE-subsidised programmes) for International Students. For more information on Service Obligation scheme, please refer to: https://nusgs.nus.edu.sg/service-obligation-scheme/.

- a) Students, who are required to pay Liquidated Damages (LD) to MOE for breaking the bond, would have to pay the total amount of MOE subsidy under Service Obligation (reflected in their individual student bill) plus 10% interest rate compounded at the end of each academic year.
- 8. The <u>published</u> version of the Fee Table only reflects fees for the latest five cohorts of students.
- 9. Fees for programmes in the following institutions may be found on their respective websites: <u>Lee Kuan Yew School of Public Policy; Duke-NUS Medical School;</u> and <u>NUS-ISS</u>.

10. Special Term:

Fees are chargeable for students on coursework programmes reading courses in Special Term.

a) Full-time and part-time students admitted from AY2019/2020 are charged on a per Unit basis based on the respective full-time student rates, for courses they read during the Special Term. The fee calculation is based on a full-time student taking a <u>maximum load of 20-24 Units</u> in a regular semester or 40-48 Units per annum as per their programme requirement. Fees for full-time and part-time students are the same for the courses read in Special Term.

The table below shows an example of per Unit and 4-Units course fees payable by Arts & Social Sciences (Coursework) students who are admitted in AY2024/2025 and read the full programme requirement of 40 Units in AY2025/2026.

- b) Full-time and part-time students from intakes earlier than AY2019/2020 will pay 25% of the fees payable for a regular semester for the courses read during the Special Term. Fees for full-time and part-time students are the same for the courses read in Special Term.
- c) Students taking courses from self-funded programmes will pay the fees per course as specified by the programmes.
- 11. Master of Architecture SPR/IS students from NUS Concurrent Degree Programme (CDP) will enjoy the MOE subsidy based on the admission year of their Bachelor of Architecture programme and commencement of Master of Architecture programme.
