Cumulative Average Point

The Cumulative Average Point (CAP) was introduced for students admitted from the academic year 1998-1999 onwards to track the progress of students under the Modular System. It is the weighted average grade point of all modules taken by the student. Modules with no assigned modular credit or grade point are excluded from the calculation of CAP.

Modular Credit

A modular credit (MC) is a unit of the effort, stated in terms of time, expected of a typical student in managing his/her workload. One MC is equivalent to 2.5 hours of study and preparation per week. Thus, a 4-MC module would require 10 hours of work a week, including lectures, tutorials, laboratory sessions, assignments, and independent or group study.

Leave of Absence

Only leave of absence of one semester or longer is recorded in the transcript.

Grade-Free Scheme

The Grade-free Scheme (GFS), in the form of 32 MCs of Satisfactory/ Unsatisfactory (S/U) option, was introduced for undergraduate students admitted from AY2014/15 onwards to provide a supportive and enabling environment for them to make a successful transition into the academic and social culture of university life. It serves to facilitate a transformation in students' mindsets towards grades and learning in the university setting, as well as enable them to leverage opportunities for a holistic education. It was enhanced from a grade-free first semester to a grade-free first year for undergraduate students admitted from AY2016/17 onwards.

At the end of a semester, students may choose to retain the letter grade or to exercise the S/U option on a module, in which case the letter grade will not be shown on the transcript nor computed towards the CAP. An 'S' grade is assigned if students receive a C grade or above while a 'U' grade is assigned if the grade obtained is D+, D or F. Students will receive credits towards the degree only if they attain an 'S' grade.

With effect from AY2018/2019, students who pass a module by Supplementary Examination will receive the grade appropriate to the marks obtained, instead of only receiving a 'D' grade irrespective of the student's performance in the Supplementary Examination.

Examinable Optional Courses

Courses coded 'X0' are a one-term examinable optional course. The grades awarded are: Pass with Distinction (PD), Pass (P), Withdrawn (W).

Obtained a Cumulative Weighted Numerical Average for all modules taken at NUS that is equivalent to a grade of C or better, and do not qualify either for First Class or Second Class (Upper Division) Honours.

Third Class Honours

Completed the number of credits required for a LLB (Honours) degree but do not qualify for First Class, Second Class (Upper Division) or Second Class (Lower Division) Honours.

(ii) No student will be eligible for First Class or Second Class (Upper Division) Honours if:

- the student has failed more than 12 credits of modules at NUS (or while on an approved exchange programme); or*
- the student has taken more than 9 semesters to complete the 4-year LLB programme or 7 semesters to complete the 3-year Graduate LLB programme (excluding periods where the student has been granted a leave of absence).*

Supplementary Examination and Re-examination

Prior to 2001/02, unless otherwise indicated, a student who passes a subject by Supplementary Examination or Re-Examination is awarded only a 'D' grade irrespective of his/her performance. From 2001/02, students sitting for the First, Second and Third Professional B.D.S. Supplementary Examinations and the First, Second Professional (Part 1), Second Professional (Part 2) and Second Professional (Part 3) MBBS Supplementary Examinations will receive the grade(s) appropriate to the marks they obtain. From 2002/03, students sitting for the Final Professional B.D.S. and the Final Professional MBBS Re-Examinations will receive the grade(s) appropriate to the marks they obtain.

Barred from Examination

A student who was barred from the examination is deemed to have sat and failed the examination.

Human Resource Management

A course read by all Dentistry and Medicine students. The marks for this course are incorporated into the grades of the Final Year Examination subjects.

For Medicine students, from 2012/13, the marks are no longer incorporated into the grades of the Final Year Examination subjects.

For Dentistry students, from 2000/01, the marks for this course are incorporated into the Clinical Dentistry paper in the Final Professional BDS Examination. From 2009/10, the marks are no longer incorporated in the Clinical Dentistry paper.

Foundation in Research Skill/Special Study/Ethics Case Study Modules

The grades awarded under these subjects are: Merit (M), Pass (P).

Examinable Optional Courses

Courses coded 'X0' are a one-term examinable optional course. The grades awarded are: Pass with Distinction (PD), Pass (P), Withdrawn (W).

Cross Faculty Modules

This is an additional non-compulsory cross faculty module. For students who have read cross faculty modules offered by Faculties/Schools under the Modular System and have opted to be graded, the grading schemes used are that of the relevant Faculties/Schools.

Undergraduate Research Opportunities Programme (UROP)

For Medicine students, the grades awarded under this programme are: Distinction (DT), Merit (M), Pass (P). For Dentistry students, this is a non-examinable module and is reflected on the transcript without a grade.

(VI) Yale-NUS College

Established in 2011, Yale-NUS College is Singapore's first liberal arts college with a full residential programme that integrates living and learning. Drawing on the resources and traditions of Yale University and the National University of Singapore (NUS), it is an autonomous College within NUS with a curriculum and pedagogy that draws on the strengths of established liberal arts traditions and the diverse intellectual traditions and cultures of Asia and the world. A Yale-NUS College education emphasises broad-based multi-disciplinary learning across the natural and social sciences, humanities and the arts.

Grade-Free Semester

To assist students in the first year to successfully transition into the academic and social aspects of college life, the first 20 MC of the College's Common Curriculum modules read in the first semester are graded 'Completed Satisfactorily' (CS) or 'Completed Unsatisfactorily' (CU). Students receive credits towards the degree if the modules are Completed Satisfactorily but no grade point is assigned.

Modular Credit

A modular credit (MC) is a unit of the effort, stated in terms of time, expected of a typical student in managing his/her workload. One MC is equivalent to 2.5 hours of study and preparation per week. Thus, a 5 MC module would require 12.5 hours of work a week, including lectures, seminars, tutorials, laboratory sessions, assignments and independent or group study.

Cumulative Average Point

The Cumulative Average Point (CAP) tracks the progress of students under the modular system. It is the weighted average grade point of all modules taken by the student. Modules with no assigned modular credit or grade point are excluded from the calculation of CAP.

Honours Awards

The College awards Latin Honours to the top 35 percent of the graduating class as follows:

<i>Summa Cum Laude</i>	To not more than the top 5 percent of the graduating class.
<i>Magna Cum Laude</i>	To not more than the next 10 percent of the graduating class.
<i>Cum Laude</i>	To not more than the next 20 percent of the graduating class.
<ul style="list-style-type: none">Latin Honours will go to no more than 35 percent of a graduating class.The graduating class is defined as graduates who entered the College at the same time unless the student has been tagged by the College to graduate with a later cohort due to promotion rules or other official reasons.	

The Latin Honours are based on the Cumulative Average Point (CAP). In addition, no more than 60% or 6 of the students (whichever is larger) in any one major will receive honours at the *Cum Laude* level or above, and no more than 40% or 4 (whichever is larger) at the *Magna Cum Laude* level or above. In cases where the number of students might exceed these limits, only the top students down to the designated limits will receive the relevant honour.
